



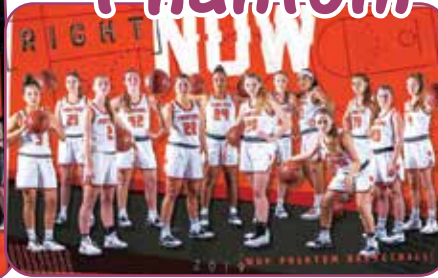

- High school students learn through partnership with Farmory: The Farmory is a program designed to bring local, sustainable, and indoor agriculture to Green Bay and the larger Northeast Wisconsin region. This non-profit organization converted an empty, former armory building into a 20,000 square foot indoor vertical aquaponics farm with the goal of teaching the community how to grow healthy foods, building excitement around associated careers, and ultimately helping others to reach self-sustainability. # Five-Year-Old Kindergarten Registration

The School District of West De Pere recently held kindergarten registration for children who are planning to attend kindergarten in the fall of 2020. In case you missed it or your child does not attend our 4K program and you are planning on sending your child to kindergarten, please register your child as soon as possible at your school of residence: Hemlock Creek Elementary School, 1900 Williams Grant Dr, De Pere or Westwood Elementary School, 1155 Westwood St, De Pere.

Children must turn five years of age on or before September 1, 2020 and live in the West De Pere School District to be eligible for the West De Pere kindergarten program. For registration, you will need to bring your child's birth certificate and proof of address. The child does not have to attend the registration. If you have any questions, please call (920) 425-1900 ext. 3320 for Hemlock Creek or (920) 337-1087 ext. 1322 for Westwood.

## Four-Year-Old Kindergarten Registration

The School District of West De Pere is now registering for our Four-Year-Old Kindergarten Program for children who would be four years of age on or before September 1, 2020, and are planning to attend Four-Year-Old Kindergarten in the fall of 2020. To register, please bring your child's birth certificate, their immunization record, and proof of residency such as a utility bill or lease agreement to either Westwood Elementary School or Hemlock Creek Elementary School.

If you have any questions concerning registration, please call Westwood Elementary at 337-1087 ext. 1322; Hemlock Creek Elementary at 425-1900 ext. 3320; or Scott Marsden, 4K Director at 337-1087 ext. 1323.

Our Four-Year-Old Kindergarten program is half days, five days a week. Depending on space availability at each site, children may be served at a location (either school or partnering child care facility) outside of their home school attendance area. If this occurs, transportation will be provided. Four-Year-Old Kindergarten is a voluntary program and no child will be required to attend. The Four-Year-Old Kindergarten program is developmentally appropriate and may include but is not limited to: readiness skills, language development, social development, emotional development, physical development, and self-help skills.

If you are not enrolled in our Four-Year-Old Kindergarten program, parents with children of kindergarten age (five years old) will be contacted via our school census report. If you are new to the area and have not completed a census form, please contact the district office at 337-1393 ext. 8010 to have your child counted on the school census. If you know a neighbor with small children, please share this information with them.

## Pre-School Developmental Screening

The School District of West De Pere offers developmental screening for preschool-aged children. The school district uses census data to mail out the Ages and Stages developmental questionnaires throughout the year, asking parents to complete the questionnaire and return it promptly by mail. As the questionnaires are returned, school professionals score them and provide written feedback to parents on the general developmental readiness of their child(ren). In certain circumstances, the school district will invite children to participate in an additional on-site screening. If you would like to request a developmental questionnaire, please call the Department of Student Services at (920) 337-1393 ext. 8012.

# Making *a Difference*



## Fighting Cancer with Grace

Grace Fuss is a student at West De Pere Middle School. When she was 7, her mom was diagnosed with breast cancer. Throughout the surgery and treatment processes, several people supported her family by providing meals, gifts, financial support, and kind words of encouragement. She remembers the impact and wanted to make a difference herself. She began making personalized glassware, had lemonade stands, sold Packer Family Night tickets, and sold honey as a way to make money to make care packages. She and her family pursued creating an actual 501c3 non-profit organization and Fighting Cancer with Grace, raised more than \$12,400 in 2019.

Grace created and donated 80 care packages to cancer patients at the Bellin Health Cancer TEAM and the Vince Lombardi Cancer Center. Care packages included: a bag, a blanket, warm fuzzy socks, a water bottle, inspirational jar (including an inspirational message for each day), word search, journal, pens, all-natural lotion and chap stick, dry soup mix, chemo cap, snacks, and a card from Grace. She also gave the doctors and nurses a treat and a card to thank them for saving lives every day.

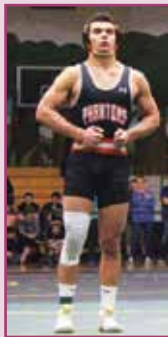
# Sports & Clubs

Five pieces of artwork from our middle school were at the Regional Youth Art Show at the Neville Museum. They were 8th grade students.

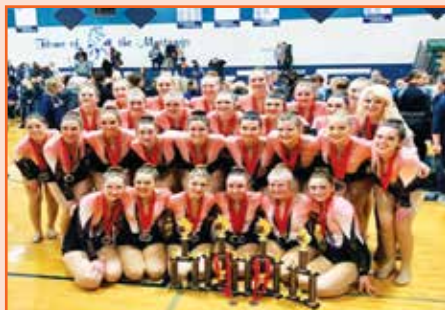

## 12 College Credits for \$1200

The Technology Education Department has a new college credit agreement with the University of Wisconsin -Green Bay. Four classes can now be taken for up to 12 UWGB credits -Parametric Modeling, Fundamentals of Drawing, Fundamentals of Engineering and Basic Manufacturing Processes. You can sign up for the classes this spring for the fall semester. (Fall 2020)

Each class will be offered with an option of receiving three credits from UWGB upon successful completion of the course. This new option offers a substantial savings on tuition with each credit being \$100 at West De Pere High School compared to \$328 at UWGB. Class grading is also weighted on a 5.0 grade scale. The credits will transfer to most UW system colleges, Northern Michigan and Michigan Tech. # Census

Who needs to be counted? Household members under the age of 21 who reside at a West De Pere School District address need to be recorded on our school census even if they do not attend or plan on attending West De Pere Public Schools. If you are living

in the West De Pere School District and your children attend a private school or attend school in a different district than West De Pere, they still need to be counted on the school census of the district in which they reside.
