Below is a summary of a few items we have recently accomplished and/or are working on.

- <u>The WDP App launched in November:</u> Our new App currently has had over 1000 downloads and continues to grow. It serves as yet another method of communication both within and outside of the District. If you have not yet taken time to download it, I encourage you to do so.
- <u>More options for students at the High School.</u> It is important that we continue to emphasize practices that prioritize student needs to ensure a multitude of pathways toward student success. These upcoming changes provide yet another avenue for students to pursue their interests.
- Family and Consumer Science courses are to be restructured into pathways of culinary arts, health care, and human services. Included in the new pathways are new courses such as Baking and Pastry Arts, Medical Terminology and Student Success, Relationships, Foods Around the World, and Human Services.
- In the Technology Education Department we will offer Residential Design and Construction as a new course.
- The Science Department is in the process of developing a new summer course opportunity, which will launch in the summer of 2024. "Pushing the Boundaries" will be a five day environmental experience in the Boundary Waters of Minnesota.
- <u>Upgrading facilities</u>: In order to ensure that our facilities remain up to date, we are in the process of optimizing the function of the office area at Westwood Elementary with an office renovation, as well as, improving food service operations at the Middle School with an improvement in the food service area. Additionally, the Middle School will be having two new chillers installed this spring. All projects should be completed and ready for full use by the start of the 2023-24 school year.





Virtual Reality

Virtual Reality is a technology that has the ability to transport students to different places, letting them experience scenes such as a forest or another planet as if they were there while being engaging and interactive. While reading about an ancient civilization or looking at pictures of a heart, students could then experience the content via VR, which places them in the actual scene. This increases an understanding and retention of the material and also helps students literally see the world in new ways.

Through the use of West De Pere's

Expeditions 2.0 Virtual Reality Kit students have had the opportunity to visit places all over the world! 1st graders at Hemlock Creek visited the Moon while learning about space. 4th graders visited several sites related to the American Revolution to help build their background knowledge before starting a new reading unit. 6th grade students at the Intermediate School observed different structures (pyramids, skyscrapers, and bridges) before building their own and



photoshopping them with appropriate surroundings.

The VR headsets are easy for students to navigate, and they have the potential to enhance the learning experience at all age levels.



A Swedish Experience

Before Christmas, the students in Sue Lutz's 5th-grade class held an extraordinary Zoom meeting with their pen pals that has been eleven years in the making. Since 2012, Mrs. Lutz has been collaborating with teachers in De Pere's Sister City, Åmål, Sweden. Each year, at least two batches of letters typically criss-cross the ocean. These letters are especially vital to young Swedish students that have just started to learn English: they eagerly study each letter to scrutinize the spelling and grammatical structure then craft their own responses under the guidance of their teachers. Since the pandemic, Zoom meetings have become commonplace even for young students. What set THIS one apart, however, was that Ms. Lutz was in Sweden herself during the meeting! She was one of two De Pere educators invited to join the De Pere Sister Cities delegation overseas in



recognition of their work with students in Åmål. Both she and De Pere High School's Randy Soquet met the teachers they have been working with over the years and spent several days in the region getting a deep dive into Swedish culture. For her, this was a precious, unprecedented opportunity to learn and grow as an educator, and feels more than ever that connecting the youth of the world is one of our greatest hopes for the future. When she delivered the



Middle School Choir News


Four 8th-grade choir students participated in the Wisconsin Choral Directors

WEST DE PERE SCHOOL DISTRICT 4K PROGRAM

The School District of West De Pere has scheduled 4-Year-Old Kindergarten registration dates for children who would be 4 years of age on or before September 1, 2023, and are planning to attend 4-Year Old Kindergarten in the fall of 2023.

Registration will take place on Thursday, March 9 from 4:30 - 7:30 p.m.

To register, please bring proof of residence (a utility bill works great), an original birth certificate, and an immunization record/waiver to either Westwood Elementary School or Hemlock Creek Elementary School.

Our 4-Year-Old Kindergarten program is half days, five days a week. Depending on space availability at each site, children may be served at a location (either school or partnering child care facility) outside of their home school attendance area. All Four-Year-Old Kindergarten students are eligible for busing. Four-Year-Old Kindergarten is a voluntary program and no child will be required to attend. The Four-Year-Old Kindergarten program is developmentally appropriate and may include but is not limited to: readiness skills, language development, social development, emotional development, physical development, and self-help skills.

If you are new to the area and have not completed a census form, please contact the district office at (920) 337-1393 ext. 8010 to have your child counted on the school census. If you know a neighbor with small children, please share this information with them.

If you have any questions concerning registration, please call Westwood Elementary at (920) 337-1087 ext. 1315; Hemlock Creek Elementary at (920) 425-1900 ext. 3321, or Mike Kowalczyk, 4K Director at (920) 425-1900 ext. 3327.

Pre-School Developmental Screening

The School District of West De Pere offers developmental screening for preschool-aged children. The school district uses census data to mail out the Ages and Stages developmental questionnaires throughout the year, asking parents to complete the questionnaire and return it promptly by mail. As the questionnaires are returned, school professionals score them and provide written feedback to parents on the general developmental readiness of their child(ren). In certain circumstances, the school district will invite children to participate in an additional on-site screening. If you would like to request a developmental questionnaire, please call the Department of Student Services at (920) 337-1393 ext. 8012.

Five-Year-Old Kindergarten Registration

The School District of West De Pere recently held kindergarten registration for children who are planning to attend kindergarten in the fall of 2023. In case you missed it or your child does not attend our 4K program and you are planning on sending your child to kindergarten, please register your child as soon as possible at your school of residence: Hemlock Creek Elementary School, 1900 Williams Grant Dr, De Pere or Westwood Elementary School, 1155 Westwood St, De Pere.

Children must turn five years of age on or before September 1, 2023, and live in the West De Pere School District to be eligible for the West De Pere kindergarten program. For registration, you will need to bring your child's birth certificate and proof of address to the elementary school office. The child does not have to attend the registration. If you have any questions, please call (920) 425-1900 ext. 3320 for Hemlock Creek or (920) 337 1087 ext. 1322 for Westwood.

*Please note that immunization requirements can be waived only if a properly signed health, religious, or personal conviction waiver is filed with the school.

Census

The Census counts every person in the 50 states, District of Columbia and the five U.S. territories. The Census is mandated by the Constitution and the information will provide critical data for government officials, business owners, lawmakers and many others. Over \$765 billion in federal funding is allocated annually to hospitals, schools, fire departments, roads and other resources based on census data. Beginning in mid-March, households will receive an invitation to participate in the Census online, by phone or by paper. Help shape the future of our schools and community by filling out the Census. We need your help in planning for the future in the West De Pere School District. If you have not previously filled out our Census Form, you have just moved, or you are new to the District, please contact the District Office of West De Pere or your child's school to request one.

Who needs to be counted? Household members under the age of 21 who reside at a West De Pere School District address need to be recorded on our school census even if they do not attend or plan on attending West De Pere Public Schools. If you are living in the West De Pere School District and your child(ren) attend a private school or attend school in a different district than West De Pere, they still need to be counted on the school census of the district in which they

reside.

How to complete the form-

- If you have children under the age of 21 who reside at a West De Pere School District address. Be sure to include any post office box or apartment number with the actual address of the residence.
- If there are no children under the age of 21 residing at a West De Pere school district address, please complete the address section on the form, indicate there are no children under the age of 21, and return the form. We will then remove your address from our records.
