

However, the always-present potential for a high number of parent requests prevents us from guaranteeing any requests.

- 1. Requests must be communicated in writing (an email is sufficient) to the principal no later than April 5, 2024.
- 2. Requests must be based on a specific educational need.
- 3. Requests should not reference an individual teacher by name.
 Rather, the request could reference a teaching style, a classroom, or some other special need.

A message from your Principal



Welcome Back, Westwood! I hope you all had a wonderful and relaxing Spring Break. While it is good to get away, it is always good to be back at Westwood and have the building return to life.

As the weather gets warmer and there is more opportunity for kids to go outside and play, I decided to take a risk this month. I decided to write about technology, devices, and the impact that may be having on our kids. I will preface my article by saying I'm not an expert, I'm not judging, nor am I lecturing about parenting. Instead, I hope to offer some ideas that may create an opportunity for reflection and discussion.

My wife and I hosted our family gathering for Easter. We had a full house that spanned generations. We had 80-year-olds to 2-year-olds and everything in between. During the day I was struck by how often people disengaged with each other and instead focused on their phones. The age of the person didn't matter. At some point, everyone spent time with their face buried in their phone scrolling Facebook, Instagram, X, or Snapchat. Now, maybe this is more a reflection of the quality of relationships and conversations my family had during the day rather than an indication of a societal change. Still, I'd like to think my family is fairly typical. As I went to bed, I began to think about how the phones and devices took away from our interactions.

Over the break, I began reading a book by author Johnathan Haidt titled The Anxious Generation. I'm not finished reading it, but I can share a brief synopsis of the book's content. The book explores the shift from a play-based childhood in the 1980s to the phone-based childhood of the present day. Specifically, he explores how phones and social media have resulted in a re-wiring of children's neurological systems and at the same time increased the number of children who are exhibiting symptoms of anxiety, depression, and social isolation. While many people have thought COVID was the sole reason for changes in our children's mental health, it's important to recognize that COVID had an impact, but the changes were beginning before 2019-2020.


The experience with my family and reading the book left me thinking about the opportunity that spring and summer have to help us break free from phone-based childhoods. It's a time in which we can tell kids to put their devices, video games, and phones away. Tell them to go outside, get dirty, explore, and grow their curiosity. It's also an opportunity to play with their siblings and neighbors. The amount of time kids get to play in their life is short. There will be plenty of time for devices when they are older. Right now, let them play.
