
## A Note From Mrs. Held

#### **Did You Know?**

When we encounter any type of print our goal is to be a skilled reader. A skilled reader is fluent, has word recognition and can comprehend the print. In the "brain of a reader" we have two strands that are intertwined to help us become skilled readers. One is the language comprehension strand that includes background knowledge, vocabulary, language structure, verbal reasoning, and literacy knowledge. The other strand is word recognition which includes phonological awareness, decoding and sign recognition. Learning to read is very complex and has many strands. Did you know that



reading aloud is the single most important factor to help children become proficient, avid readers? Reading aloud introduces new vocabulary, builds background knowledge and exposes children to language and text structures and gives them a positive interaction with books. When you have conversations about what you are reading aloud together (interactive reading), that helps to build vocabulary and verbal fluency skills. What was your favorite book as a child? What is your favorite book to read to your children now?




## **LIBRARY NEWS**


#### **Mock Caldecott**


















### **Family Book Club**

## School Counselor Corner Mrs. Hettmann & Mrs. Crozier

National School Counseling Week is February 3rd-7th!
The purpose of this week is to highlight the unique and integral role school counselors play in student success.
School counselors work with all students to remove barriers to learning by addressing students' academic concerns, teaching social/emotional skills, and helping students plan for careers.



During the month of February, our K-4 students will be learning how to be problem-solvers! Students will be learning how to solve common disagreements between two or more people, such as disagreeing with a friend about what to play. Students will practice thinking about what each person wants as a way to say the problem without blame and to help them think of different possible solutions

#### **Practice at Home**

- If problems or disagreements arise between siblings or friends, help your child say the problem respectfully, without blaming others. For example, encourage them to say "I've been waiting for a turn with the basketball" instead of "you never take turns with the basketball."
- Notice and praise your child when they take steps to help solve problems, such as when they ask for what they want or need to solve a problem.
- Help your child practice thinking about pros and cons of different possible solutions to disagreements or problems. Ask, if you choose that solution, what would go well for you? What could go wrong? How would it work out for your friend?
- When reading books or watching a show, help your child recognize problems between characters and talk about ways to solve them.
- Remind your child that they solve problems best when they are calm. It is normal to feel upset when there is a problem. Encourage them to take a break, as needed, before problem-solving.

# 2024-25 Wisconsin Forward Exam Window Open in March

From March 17 through April 25 Wisconsin students will once again be taking the Wisconsin Forward Exam. The Wisconsin Forward is the test that schools are required to give to students in grades 3-8 and 10. Questions on the Forward Exam will measure each student's achievement relative to grade level expectations in two areas: English language arts and mathematics. In addition, a science test will be given to fourth and eighth grade students and a social studies test will be administered to fourth, eighth and tenth grade students. All testing sessions are online and untimed, so students can take breaks without their score being impacted.

#### **OPEN ENROLLMENT**

Wisconsin's public school enrollment program allows parents to apply for their children to attend school districts other than the one in which they live. Open enrollment application dates for the 2025-2026 school year are February 3 - April 30, 2025 at 4:00 p.m.. If you have moved out of the district, and wish for your child to remain at the West De Pere Schools, please pick up an Open Enrollment Application and Change of Address form at the school office or at the District Office. By state law, the April 30th deadline cannot be extended. The State will not allow any exceptions to this timeline.
