Attendance Reminders

To ensure accurate attendance records, please follow these guidelines:

Reporting Absences:

If your child will be absent due to illness, arriving late due to an appointment, or leaving school early, please notify the school office by calling the attendance line at (920) 425-1900 (select option 2) or emailing Jamie Schnurer at jschnurer@wdpsd.com.

Unexcused Ansences:

If the school does not receive notification regarding your child's absence, the office will contact you for the confirmation. Absences without parent or guardian notification will be marked as "unexcused."

Vacation Notification:

For planned absences of two or more days due to vacation, please inform both the office and your child's teacher in advance via email.

Half-Day Absences:

Students arriving after 9:00 AM or leaving before

3:15 PM will received a half-day absence on their attendance record. Note that early release days are treated as FULL DAYS for attendance purposes.

Medical Notes:

Absences supported by medical documentation will not be counted towards truancy.

School Counselor Corner

During Phantom Skills in the month of January, our Kindergarten, 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th graders students will learn how to show empathy and kindness in friendships. Here are a few ways to teach kindness and empathy to your child at home:

- Be kind to yourself. It's hard to be kind to others if we do not take care of ourselves.
- **Try starting a gratitude practice.** This can be as simple as having each family member talk about what they are grateful for during dinner. You can also encourage your child to make a card for someone special to express gratitude towards that special someone.
- Show empathy when you read a book or watch a movie together. If you see a character experiencing an intense emotion, ask your child, "How do you think they feel? Tell your child to look at the character's face to give them clues.

Grief Support Opportunity

To better meet the needs of our students, Hemlock Creek Elementary School is pleased to offer our students the opportunity to participate in a Grief Support Group in collaboration with Unity Grief and Education Center.

One of our Hemlock Creek School Counselors Cheryl Crozier, and a Unity Grief Counselor will be leading a **six-week grief support group** designed to provide students the opportunity to explore their grief through activities and conversation while learning about grief and developing coping skills. This group will meet during the school day.

Through participating in this group, we hope students gain insights into their own grief experience as well as make connections with peers who have also experienced a loss while in a safe, supportive environment.

DISTRICT RESIDENT REQUEST FOR SCHOOL TRANSFER (POLICY #5007)

District residents who request to transfer schools within the School District of West De Pere for the 2025–2026 school year are due January 31, 2025. Guidelines to the West De Pere policy #5007 are:

- Only written requests will be considered.
- Requests by district residents for school transfer shall be made in writing during the month of January. Requests received after January 31st may be considered if space is available.
 Applicants should submit their written request by completing the "District Residents Request for School Transfer" form. Written requests should be submitted to the school office. Final decisions will be made by the building principals.
 Parents/guardians have the right to appeal decisions to the district office.
