## SCHOOL DISTRICT OF WEST DE PERE <br> INTERSCHOLASTIC ACTIVITIES

The Board believes individual students will benefit through opportunities to grow physically and intellectually through their experiences in self-discipline and their contribution to team effort made possible through competitive interscholastic and intramural team and individual activities.

It is the Board's policy to provide students interscholastic competition in a variety of areas. Such students shall also receive recognition for involvement without cost to the students.

Students shall be allowed to participate providing they meet and maintain the requirements of the school and state activity codes. In all cases, students shall consider participation a privilege and not an entitlement, and should accept the responsibility of representing the schools in a positive manner. Failure to do so will result in the loss of privilege as determined by school and state guidelines.

The purpose of school activities is both educational and recreational. The activity program should encourage participation by as many boys and girls as possible and should be carried on with the best interests of the participants as the first consideration. The Board encourages the participation of all students in extracurricular activities. "Participation" means fair and equitable participation to the extent that the budget, facilities or type of activity allows. As such, the practice of cutting in elementary through 10th grade is to be discouraged and team rosters generally filled to WIAA maximum levels.

It is recognized that a well organized and well conducted activity program is a potent factor in the morale of a school student body and an important phase of good community-school relations. Too great an emphasis on winning contests or too consistent a record of losing them are both harmful to the development of good attitudes among students and the public.

The activity program is an integral part of the school curriculum and comes under the authority of the principal to the same degree as do all other phases of the curriculum. Scheduling of extracurricular practices/events should be done without unreasonable interference with other school and community obligations. Staff members having direct responsibility for programs are required to follow established Board and administrative policy.

## SCHOOL DISTRICT OF WEST DE PERE COORDINATING COMMUNITY/SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

The Board of Education believes that it is in the best interest of all students that calendar parameters be established to guide various community groups in scheduling activities. To assist in developing a common understanding between community and school, these school activity guidelines shall be followed:
A. This policy shall emphasize parameters for all school activities, not just sports.
B. Wednesday school activities should end at 5:45 6:00 p.m. thus allowing students to depatt the buildings by 6:00 p.m. Scheduling of any evening activities on Wednesday will be avoided in deference to community related activities. Students participating in community related activities on Wednesdays will be allowed to leave school activities early if necessary.
C. The schools may use Wednesday evenings from May 1 through the end of the school year for banquets, events. ete.
D. Activities scheduled on Sundays or holidays shall be limited in nature. Exceptions can be made on Sunday if not scheduled before 12:00 noon and approved by building administration.
E. There shall be no school activities when the schools are closed because of adverse weather conditions.

Exceptions to the above guidelines may be made by a building administrator when a group has a schedule change requiring Wednesday competitions, a regularly scheduled competition on Monday, or has won the privilege of advancing to a higher level of competition. In this instance, a building Principal or Director of Student Activities may approve of a request from a coach for practice on the Sunday preceding the contest., providing students' attendanee at the session is not compulsory. These practices may not begin before 12:00 noon.

## SCHOOL DISTRICT OF WEST DE PERE

The School Board shall require a physical examination including a chest x-ray or tuberculin test, and may require pre-employment drug test of every regular full time, regular part time, and contracted school employee as a condition of employment. Freedom of tuberculosis in a communicable form is a condition of employment, or shall eondition offers of employment on sueh testing. Offers of employment are contingent on test results. Prospective employees who present non-negative test results and are reviewed/ andcertified by an approved physician as non-negative willmay not be offered employment or will-may have any current offer of employment already rescinded. Additional physical examinations shall may be required thereafter as determined by the Board.

Such examination shall not be required of any employee who files an affidavit stating that the employee depends exclusively upon prayer or spiritual means for healing in accordance with a bonafide religious sect unless there is reasonable cause to believe that such employee is suffering from an illness detrimental to the health of students.

In the case of a new employee, submitted proof of such examination taken within the past 90 days may be permitted.

School employee, as stated in this policy, means a person who comes in contact with children or who handles or prepares food for children while they are under the supervision of school authorities.

The examination and pre-employment drug test will be made by a physician or agency designated by the School Board and the cost will be paid out of school district funds, with the exeeption of including substitute employees.

## SUPPORT STAFF

## PROBATIONARY PERIOD

All newly hired support staff employees shall serve a probationary period of one hundred eighty (180) consecutive calendar days from the first day of employment.

During the probationary period, staff shall be provided with the appropriate training and supervisory opportunities to enhance their performance and understanding of position expectations.

New employees shall be evaluated in writing by the appropriate supervisor prior to consultation with the Superintendent. Such evaluation shall be based on the job description and observation of performance.

Prior to the end of the probationary period, the Superintendent, in consultation with the appropriate supervisor, shall either grant continued employment or discharge the employee. Should circumstances warrant it, any probationary employee will be discharged at any time considered appropriate by the Superintendent within the probationary period. In all cases employment or discharge, the Board shall be informed.

As probationary periods afford the Distriet the opportunity to adequately appraise new employees, the Board feels employees shall be eompensated for the satisfactory completion of a probationary period. As sueh, salary sehedules will refleet sueh for support staff whe satisfactorily complete the probationary period.

## SALARY SCHEDULES

It shall be the policy of the Board of Education to compensate employees fairly through a salary schedule based on experience and responsibility.

Each year, in consultation with the Administration, the Board shall establish compensation for the support staff. Such compensation shall be distributed fairly to all employees, reflecting responsibility, performance and worth to the district.

## EVALUATION

It is the belief of the Board of Education that staff productivity and morale is enhanced through fair and open evaluation. Evaluation affords staff and administration greater communication, clarifies job responsibilities and expectations, and increases opportunities for improvement through goal setting.

As such, the Board of Education directs the administration to evaluate support staff in writing at least once every three years. Such evaluation shall be based on the job description, observations, and progress towards any appropriate and established goals. Written evaluations will be discussed with the staff involved, and a copy placed in their district personnel file.

## SCHOOL DISTRICT OF WEST DE PERE PUBLIC RECORDS NOTICE TO EMPLOYEES

Section 19.33(1) of the Statutes requires each "authority" under the public records law to provide the name of the legal custodian and a description of the nature of his or her duties under the public records and property law to all employees of the authority entrusted with records subject to the legal custodian's supervision.

The Superintendent has been designated as the legal custodian of records for the West De Pere School Board or any school district authority.

The legal custodian is vested by the West De Pere School Board with full legal power to render decisions and carry out the duties of the West De Pere School Board under the Public Records and Property Law. Requests for access to records shall be referred to the legal custodian in writing or on forms provided by the West De Pere School District of West De Pere.

The legal custodian will determine whether a record of the West De Pere School Board must be made available for inspection and/or copying by a requester, or whether the request may be denied.

## Frequently Asked Questions

Will I receive a confirmation before summer school starts?
Your online registration is your confirmation. Please print out a copy to keep for your records. If you have not received a confirmation then your registration is not complete.

## What if my child is going to be absent?

In the event of an absence, call the Summer School office at (920)425-1900 x3100. Please leave a message indicating your student's name, the courses they will be missing, and the location.

## What if my child's transportation or schedule changes?

If there is any change to your child's schedule, whether it be transportation, missing a class, or not participating in the Community Center day camp, or Fallen Timbers in the afternoon please contact the Summer School office at (920)425-1900 x 3100.

## Where do I drop off and pick up my child? Is there supervision?

Supervision will start at 7:50 and we ask that students not be dropped off prior to that time. Please pick up students no later than 10 minutes after their class ends. If you are going to be later than 10 minutes please call the school in which your child is attending class.
Drop off and pick up is in front of the building at Hemlock Creek and at Westwood Elementary schools and at door \#1 at WDP Middle School. Students attending the wrestling class at the high school will use the school entrance on Helena Street. Wrestling and Track \& Field students will use the facility entrance on Helena Street.

## Is transportation provided?

Transportation to and from Summer School is not provided for students. There is a shuttle that will run between the High School, Westwood and Hemlock Creek between 9:40-10:05 Students attending classes at the Middle School are able to walk to Westwood to catch the shuttle to Hemlock Creek/High School. All students must be dropped off at their start school and picked up at their finishing school - transportation will only be provided in the middle of the 2 sessions.
There will also be a bus for all students attending the Fallen Timbers sessions.

## Can my child ride their bike to school?

Yes, they must be locked securely in the bicycle racks. No skateboards or rollerblades are allowed.

## How will I find my child?

We recommend that parents/guardians set up a meeting spot with their child prior to the first day of classes. If your child is an elementary student, the teacher will walk students to the door and stay with them until they are picked up. Please park in a parking spot and walk to the front of the building to meet your child. We ask that students be picked up no later than 10 minutes after their class ends. There is no parking in front of the buildings as that is an emergency lane. For the safety of all, please drive slowly, cautiously and exercise patience.

## Do I need supplies?

Basic supplies are covered. Some courses may require additional supplies and are listed in the course descriptions.

## Does my child need a snack?

Your child is welcome to bring a snack from home. If the teacher sends a letter regarding an allergy in the classroom, please take that into consideration when sending a snack with your child. Some classes will provide a snack.

## What if my child has an allergy?

Allergy information is provided to the teachers based on the information the parent/guardian provides on the registration form. Please contact the Summer School office if you need to provide further information or have questions regarding the class.

## Can my child attend Summer School if they are in daycare over the summer?

Parents/guardians will need to check with their daycare provider to see if they provide transportation to and from summer school locations.

## What time are classes?

Most classes run each morning from 8:00 a.m.-10:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. Students may take classes at 8:00 and/or 10:00.

## Can my child have their cell phone during Summer School?

Students may possess cell phones while they are in summer school, but they must be turned off and out of sight during class sessions unless the teacher is incorporating them into the class. If it becomes an issue, the Summer School staff may ask for it to remain at home.

If we reside within the WDP district boundaries, but our children do not attend a WDP school, can they still participate in Summer School?
Yes, they may participate in the Summer School program.

What is the refund policy for Summer School?
To keep class costs at a minimum to no cost, please attend when signing up. It is important our teachers can plan and order supplies based on their enrollment. Students who don't show up will result in excess district funds being spent for no reason. All classes are subject to cancellation by the Summer School Director. Any class that does not have sufficient enrollment may be canceled. If a class is canceled, alternative classes will be available. A refund will not be issued if a student decides to drop a class once the session begins.

WIAA and the sport of Lacrosse
Lacrosse has been a club sport at De Pere High School since 2007. In 2020, the club formed a partnership with West De Pere. This allowed West De Pere students to participate on the team under lacrosse's Wisconsin (non-WIAA) governing organization. In 2019, girls lacrosse started. Both teams use both schools' facilities and have incorporated a combined logo/color scheme in their uniforms.

On December 2, 2022, the WIAA adopted girls and boys lacrosse as spring sports for the 2023-2024 school year. If schools choose to opt into the WIAA for lacrosse, they will be governed under all WIAA rules and regulations and participate in a WIAA state tournament.

This is a similar progression in the 2007-2008 school year for hockey. De Pere and West De Pere formed a WIAA co-operative program, and the team still exists today.

The athletics departments of both schools recommend that we do the same for boys and girls lacrosse. Board approval from both districts is required, and our application has to be submitted to the WIAA by June 1, 2023.

There are a number of logistical pieces, and we have worked successfully with De Pere and sport supporters in boys and girls hockey and girls swim. All of those have worked, and continue to compete today. We forecast a similar outcome in lacrosse.

We propose adopting lacrosse as a WIAA sport for 23-24 with no financial commitment and no change in the process of the sport from the school next year. We propose a multi-year gradual progression for the sport to be fully administered and fully funded by the two schools. Lacrosse boosters are supportive. This worked for boys hockey.

## Summary

I recommend that we add boys and girls lacrosse as WIAA sports in 2023-2024. These would be co-operative programs with West De Pere like we have for boys hockey and girls swim. We will work with West De Pere and lacrosse leadership to present a plan for the sport to be fully administered and fully funded by the two schools over a number of years.
