A Note From Mrs. Held

March is around the corner, and hopefully, spring is on the way! Spring break will be the week of March 24, with an early release on Friday, March 21. We hope you all have a restful, fun, and healthy spring break.

March also marks the beginning of state testing for our WI Forward exam, which grade 3 and grade 4 students participate in. The testing window opens on March 17. If possible, we ask that you avoid scheduling appointments for your child during their testing time. If a student misses a test, they will make it up at another time and/or day. Students will practice with their teachers beforehand to familiarize themselves with the online system. During this testing period, please help ensure your child gets a good night's sleep, stays hydrated, and eats a healthy breakfast. Classroom teachers will share a specific testing schedule as we approach March 17.

Did you know that the State of Wisconsin expects student attendance rates to be at 90%? Attendance rates can vary weekly, and we understand that illness may cause absences. However, regular school attendance is crucial for a student's academic success, as it allows them to consistently access

instruction, participate in classroom activities, and keep up with the class. Frequent absences can result in learning gaps. If your child's attendance at Hemlock Creek falls below state expectations, you may receive an attendance letter from Mr. Kowalczyk or a phone call. If there are barriers preventing your child from attending school, we want to work with you to find a solution.

You may have also noticed that attendance is being monitored for students with a Personal Reading Plan in grades K-3. The system automatically marks attendance concerns if a child's attendance was below 90% on the day their plan was created. Additionally, the Spring Act 20 screening for grades K-3 will begin the week of April 7.

Lastly, we are excited to celebrate March is Reading Month! There are many literacy activities planned throughout the month, so be sure to check SeeSaw posts and our Hemlock Creek Facebook page.

During the week of March 10, we will welcome an artist-in-residence who will be working in the art classrooms. Thank you to the PTO for funding this wonderful opportunity for our students!




School Counselor Corner Mrs. Hettmann & Mrs. Crozier

During the month of March, students will begin the Bullying Prevention unit in Phantom Skills. Students learn the definition of bullying, how to refuse bullying by standing up for themselves and others, and reporting bullying to an adult.

What is Bullying?

Bullying includes behaviors such as hitting, teasing, spreading rumors and gossip, stealing, and excluding someone from a group. Bullying actions are carried out on purpose with the intent to harm someone. Bullying is usually a repeated activity and it always involves a power imbalance. The person bullying has more power due to factors such as age, size, strength, support of friends, and access to resources such as toys.



Children and adults sometimes find it difficult to recognize bullying. For example, a fight between friends or rough play between children with equal power are not bullying situations. They become bullying, however, when one person has more power and uses it to hurt, frighten, or exclude the other person

Promoting Respectful Behavior at Home:

Children need to learn that respectful behavior is an essential part of all relationships. Below are some strategies for reinforcing that idea with your child:

- Plan time each day to talk with your children about any joys or difficulties they encounter.
 When problems come up, help your children think of respectful, cooperative ways to solve them.
- Keep tabs on your children's Internet use. Bullying over the Internet, also called cyber bullying, is growing rapidly.
- Help your children see other points of view. Children who bully often have difficulty
 interpreting facial expressions or tone of voice. They forget to consider other children's
 feelings. Explore with your children how they might feel "in someone else's shoes."
- Role-play friendship-developing social skills with your child. For example, you could help him or her practice making conversation, joining a group activity, being respectful, and being assertive. Friendships can help buffer a child from the harmful effects of bullying.
- Advise your child to report all bullying incidents to an adult at school or a parent. Help your child be specific in describing bullying incidents: who, what, where, when.

Requests will be taken into consideration, but are not guaranteed. We work to make sure our classrooms are balanced as much as possible. A letter will be coming home in Tuesday notes. 
4K Registration for 2025-2026

To be eligible for 4K enrollment, your child must turn 4 years of age on or before September 1st, 2025 and live in the West De Pere School District.
