Physical Education Mrs. Lozar Mr. Zornow	We are working on strategies of net wall games by covering an area of the court, hitting to open spaces, and varying force on the ball to hit to where the opponent least expects it. We use these strategies in both volleyball and eclipse ball (volleyball with a tennis racquet) and again in April with pickleball. March 5th starts rollerblading. Students can bring their own rollerblades as long as they have a working brake. Please bring helmets from home as well. All gear can be stored at school as long as it is labeled with the student's name.
<u>STEM</u> Mrs. Kohl	 General STEM: -We are still collecting <i>cereal boxes</i>, <i>paper towel cardboard inserts</i> and <i>caps to detergent bottles</i>. We have enough bottle caps- so thank you! Feel free to send them with your child to STEM or drop them off in the office labeled "STEM." 5th Grade STEM: Students are working through a coding unit utilizing mostly JavaScript block coding. Each student progresses at their own pace. Next up is the Robotics Unit. 6th Grade STEM: 6th grade STEM students completed a coding unit where they worked to finish 25 challenges. Next they enter the tabletop Game Unit where they make their own games with a random bag of materials. Progress reports are sent home after each unit so you can see your student's progress.
<u>Guidance</u> <u>Class (5th</u> Grade) Mr. Johnson	For the month of March we will continue lessons on peer problem solving. Students will review and role play out multiple ways to solve problems they are having with friends/classmates. The March Phantom Phundamental of Respect will also be a lesson. Fifth Graders have Guidance class once every six school days.
