Parent requests for class placement

In past years, parent requests for class placement have been allowed at the middle school. This practice will continue for the 2025-2026 school year. Parent requests regarding class placement will be given full consideration if all of the following conditions have been met:

- 1. Requests must be communicated in writing to the principal no later than June 6, 2025.
- 2. Requests must be based on a specific educational need.
- 3. Requests should not reference an individual teacher by name. Rather, the request could reference a teaching style, a classroom environment, or some other special need. Every class placement request that satisfies all of the conditions described above will be given full consideration. However, the always-present potential for a high number of parent requests prevents us from guaranteeing any request.

Student Service Scholarship

- Utilization of Phantom Phundamentals will be strongly evaluated by the committee during the review process.

Physical Education Class – Archery Unit

Starting on March 31st, we will be starting our archery unit. Archery is not only a physically engaging sport but also one that requires focus, discipline, and precision. It offers a unique opportunity for students to develop both their physical skills and mental concentration. During this three-week unit, all students will be required to participate in shooting steps, which are essential for understanding the fundamentals of archery.



To ensure the safety and proper understanding of the sport, we have implemented a few guidelines:

- 1. **Rules Quiz on Ed Puzzle**: Before students are allowed to shoot, they must complete a rules and safety quiz on Ed Puzzle and score 100%. This ensures that they have a comprehensive understanding of the safety protocols and rules associated with archery.
- 2. **Off-Task or Safety Concerns**: Any student found to be off-task or posing a safety concern during class will be excluded from participating in the archery unit for the entire three-week duration. This policy is in place to maintain a safe learning environment for all students and to emphasize the importance of following instructions and safety procedures. We take the safety and well-being of our students very seriously, and there will be no exceptions to this policy.

If your child has any specific concerns or questions regarding the archery unit, please do not hesitate to reach out to the WDPMS Physical Education Department. Additionally, if your child requires any special accommodations or considerations, please inform your child's teacher so that we can ensure their full participation and enjoyment of the unit. Personal bows that are currently used during the archery club will also be allowed in class with the same storage expectations.



Golf Club

Are you interested in joining the Middle School Golf Club (6th-8th)? There will be a parent meeting held on **Monday, April 14th at 6:00pm in the Middle School Commons**. You will meet the coach, Kyle Venhuizen and the school coordinator, Terri Schlatter. The meeting will last approximately 15-30 minutes, depending on the amount of questions. We will go over much of what is said in the newsletter below.



Students wanting to join Golf Club must complete a concussion & insurance form, a physical form must be turned into the office and the code of conduct completed. If your student has been in a different sport in the past year, most likely all of these things are completed. Golf club will be held on Mondays, Tuesday OR Thursdays at Hilly Haven Golf Course at their Lil' Haven area. Practice will be held once a week for each student from 4:00pm-5:00pm. They will work on hitting, putting and chipping as well as golf etiquette and the cost to students will be \$25 each. Space is limited to 12 participants for each of the M, T or Th practices, so it will be a "first come, first serve" for registration. Mrs. Schlatter will start collecting registration forms on Wednesday, April 16th and end on Wednesday, April 23rd. Bring in your registration form and money to Mrs. Schlatter or turn them in at the main office (either Middle School or Intermediate).
