





# A Message from the Superintendent

School has now been in session for just over a month, and what a great start it has been! Our students are already shining whether competing on the athletic fields, where they continue to demonstrate the value of hard work, commitment, and teamwork, or in the classroom, where their efforts are just as impressive.

At the elementary level, students are engaging with a new literacy resource, Benchmark Advance. Teachers and students alike have found this program both engaging and responsive to student needs. Across the district, all of our schools have been taking important steps to implement Professional Learning Communities. This work, whether through adjusted schedules, identifying essential learning standards, or teachers collaborating in regular professional groups reflects our staff's dedication to ensuring every student has the opportunity to succeed.

We have also strengthened school safety by introducing the Raptor Visitor Aware system in every building and incorporating Raptor into our emergency response protocols. In addition, construction on the new Technology Education Facility at the High School is set to begin this winter and will open for students at the start of the next school year.

I am proud of our students, staff, and administrators for embracing new initiatives with a clear focus on doing what is best for our kids.

While the school year is off to a strong start, challenges remain. Like many districts across the state, West De Pere has been navigating the realities of deficit budgeting. To address this,

our administrative team has implemented several costsaving measures over the past six months, including:

- Bringing most specialized transportation for students with disabilities in-house, saving \$60,000 annually.
- Relocating all 4K classrooms to Westwood Elementary, saving another \$60,000 annually.
- Having district staff take over salting of parking lots and walkways, saving approximately \$30,000 per year.
- Reducing energy usage, saving \$12,500 in August alone.
- Reassessing staffing needs when employees retire or leave, resulting in \$220,000 in savings this year.

Altogether, these changes represent more than \$384,500 in savings. While we are not there yet, these steps move us forward, and I am deeply grateful to our administrative team for their leadership and collaboration throughout this process.

As we move ahead, we remain committed to allocating resources in ways that put students first and reflect the pride that allows us to say, without hesitation: West is Best!

### October is Digital Safety Month! Quick Tips for Keeping Kids Safe Online:

- 1. Talk Together About Online Rules Set clear expectations for screen time, appropriate sites/apps, and what to do if something feels uncomfortable.
- 2. Keep Devices in Shared Spaces & Take Devices Away at Bedtime

Encourage kids to use phones, tablets, or computers in common areas like the kitchen or living room. Don't allow devices in the bedroom overnight.

- **3. Teach the Power of Pause** Remind your child not to click links, download files, or respond to messages unless they know who sent them. Encourage them not to respond when they are angry.
- **4. Protect Personal Information** Help your child understand why we don't share addresses, phone numbers, or school names online.
- **5. Model Safe Habits** *Kids learn from adults—practice good password habits, think before you post, and unplug at mealtimes.*

- **6. Check Privacy Settings Together & Consider Monitoring Software** *Go through apps and games as a family to make sure accounts are private and secure. Consider using a monitoring software.*
- **7. Encourage Open Conversations** Let your child know they can always come to you if they see something confusing, upsetting, or "off" online.
- 8. Balance Online & Offline Time Plan family activities that don't involve screens—board games, outdoor play, or reading together.

## Pre-School Developmental Screening

The School District of West De Pere offers developmental screening for preschool-aged children. The school district uses census data to mail out the Ages and Stages developmental questionnaires throughout the year, asking parents to complete the questionnaire and return it promptly by mail. As the questionnaires are returned, school professionals score them and provide written feedback to parents on the general developmental readiness of their child(ren). In certain circumstances, the school district will invite children to participate in an additional on-site screening. If you would like to request a developmental questionnaire, please call the Department of Student Services at (920) 337-1393 ext. 8012.
