

# West De Pere High School Profile

## Mission

The mission of the School District of West De Pere is to create a safe, comprehensive, educational, and social environment for students and staff, which will produce life-long learners with the capacity to succeed in the local and global community.

## Community

The West De Pere School District is located in Northeast Wisconsin just outside of Green Bay in the city of De Pere. With a population of 24,000 plus, the city of De Pere and local townships of Lawrence, Oneida, and Hobart make up the district boundaries. The district includes two K-4<sup>th</sup> elementary schools, one 5<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> intermediate school, one 7<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> middle school, one 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> high school, and a charter school known as Phantom Knight. Residents come from diverse backgrounds including rural, urban, and suburban settings.

## School

West De Pere High School is a comprehensive four-year public school enrolling 1050 students grades 9 to 12. More than 49 school sponsored clubs and co-curricular activities are offered to interested students.

## Curriculum

Academic schedules are organized by trimesters with 5 courses or 2.5 credits available per trimester. Classes run for 70 minutes, with a half hour lunch and 10-minute passing periods. Students have the option to pursue college prep, tech prep, or school to work courses of study. The West De Pere curriculum offers 150 courses from which to choose.
